

# Summary changes for the regulation of the proof of English language proficiency at Technische Universität München

07 February 2018

In accordance with Art. 13 (1) sentence 2 in conjunction with Art. 43 (5), Art. 58 (1) sentence 1 and Art. 61 (2) sentence 1 of the Bayerisches Hochschulgesetz (BayHSchG) [Bavarian Higher Education Act], the Technische Universität München issues the following amendment:

*The English version is provided merely as a convenience and is not intended to be a legally binding document.*

## § 1

18. The Examination and Academic Regulations for the Master's program in Biomedical Computing from 16 March 2009, last changed on 6 September 2016, have been changed as follows:

1. § 36 (1) no. 4:

“4. an adequate knowledge of the English language; students whose language of instruction is not English must demonstrate proficiency through an acknowledged language test such as “Test of English as a Foreign Language“ (TOEFL) (at least 88 points), “International English Language Testing System” (IELTS) (at least 6.5 points) or “Cambridge Main Suite of English Examinations”. A Bachelor's thesis written in English can also be accepted as proof of adequate knowledge of the English language,”

2. § 37 (3):

“(3) <sup>1</sup>The language of instruction of the Master's program Biomedical Computing is English. <sup>2</sup>Students who did not provide a proof of proficiency in German for the application, are admitted on condition to complete at least one module providing integrative knowledge of the German language within the first two semesters of their studies. <sup>3</sup>The course offer will be published by the examination board according to local practice. <sup>4</sup>Voluntarily completed extra-curricular modules by the TUM Language Center will be recognized.
